Over the next few weeks, the APLC and the municipality will continue monitoring Eurasian watermilfoil, in partnership with divers. It is therefore possible that new informative buoys will be installed by the APLC and we ask you to be very vigilant when you navigate near these buoys.

Although we do visual monitoring of the invasive aquatic plant, it is not always possible to see everything and we invite your participation.

Question 1. How can I be of individual service? **Answer 1.** Check around your own dock and contact the municipality or your association if you see plants that look like Eurasian watermilfoil.

Question 2. How to check if it is Eurasian watermilfoil? **Answer 2.** Rely on the images in Appendix A. If in doubt, contact us.
