Municipal Boat Launch

Dear Citizens,

Here are the access procedures for the municipal boat launch:

- ▶ From Monday to Friday, from 8:00 a.m. to 12:00 p.m. and from 1:00 p.m. to 4:30 p.m., you must present yourself at City Hall with your boat so that we can carry out a visual inspection. This is a standard procedure in effect since 2014.
- ▶ From Monday to Friday, from 4:30 p.m. to 7:00 p.m., and on Saturdays and Sundays, from 8:00 a.m. to 8:00 p.m., you must call 819-216-0377.

When you call, you must have your permit number. If you do not have it, you will need to provide your federal registration number, which will allow us to confirm that your boat is registered with the municipality.

In addition, you must provide us with a photo of the front of your boat, a photo of the side, a photo of the engine, and a photo of the trailer. These images allow us to verify the cleanliness of your boat before you access the waterway. All of this must be sent by text message.

Have you lost your boat identification sticker? We can issue you a new one. To obtain a replacement sticker, please contact us at 819-326-2674 extension 3400 / [info@municipalite.lantier.qc.ca](mailto:info@municipalite.lantier.qc.ca) or visit City Hall at 118 Crescent des Trois-Lacs.

#### IMPORTANT

Are you changing boats? Don't forget to notify us so we can cancel your current sticker and register your new boat. Are you selling your boat to another Lantier resident? Please notify us so we can make the necessary changes to our records. Please note that the municipality is not responsible for the transfer of annual permits. If you have already paid for your permit, it is your responsibility to follow up on the payment directly with the buyer.

We encourage you to read the APLC Code of Conduct, included with your invoice. Please note, this envelope contains your annual permit.

Docks and Shorelines: Let's Protect Our Lakes Together!

Abandoned Docks: Safety and the Environment. The municipal team has observed that several old docks have been left adrift or abandoned on our lakes for approximately two years. In addition to releasing pollutants into the water as they deteriorate, they pose a significant risk of accidents for boaters.

- Disposal: Please remove your old dock from the water and bring it to the Eco centre (open Wednesday to Friday from 1 p.m. to 4 p.m., and Saturday from 9 a.m. to 4 p.m.). Abandoning a dock requires municipal intervention and is subject to a fine.
- Permit required: A municipal permit is mandatory for any dock replacement or modification, even if it is exactly the same size.

The riparian buffer zone: the natural filter of our lakes. The riparian buffer zone is the area of natural vegetation bordering the lake. It acts as an essential shield to filter pollution and prevent the premature aging of our waterways.

How to preserve the health of your lake?

- No lawn mowing: Lawn mowing and clearing are strictly prohibited in the riparian buffer zone. You must maintain the three layers of natural vegetation (trees, shrubs, and herbaceous plants) to a depth of 10 meters (or 15 meters if the slope is 30% or more) from the shoreline.

No fertilizers: Do not use any fertilizers, even so-called organic ones.

Septic tanks: Ensure your septic system is functioning properly.

- Development and Access: Do you want to develop access to the lake, create a visual opening, or modify the vegetation? A municipal permit is required before undertaking any work.
